Advocate-on-Record (AoR)

The Supreme Court has recently made a historic decision by designating 11 women lawyers as senior advocates.

About Advocate-on-Record (AoR):

- AoRs are specialised lawyers authorised exclusively to file cases before the Supreme Court and serve as a vital link between **litigants and the apex court**.
- To become an AoR, a lawyer must undergo training with a court-approved AoR for at least a year, have a minimum of four years of practice, and pass an examination set by the Supreme Court covering Practice and Procedure, Drafting, Professional Ethics, and Leading Cases.
- They are required to maintain an office within a **16-kilometre** radius of the Supreme Court in Delhi and employ a **registered clerk** within one month of registration.
- The role of AoRs is underscored by Section 30 of the Advocates Act and Article 145 of the Constitution, ensuring their exclusive right to practice in the Supreme Court.
- The designation of senior advocates is a privilege that comes with the condition that they cannot solicit clients directly and are usually briefed by other lawyers, including AoRs.
