## Features of the Basic Animal Husbandry Statistics:

- The statistics include **milk**, **egg**, **meat and wool production (2022-23)** based on **Animal Integrated Sample Survey**, across three seasons.
- The Animal Husbandry Statistics (AHS) Division generates Animal Husbandry Statistics through the **Centrally Sponsored** Scheme- Livestock Census and Integrated Sample Survey.
- Its 2 components include Livestock Census (LC) and Integrated Sample Survey (ISS).

#### **Milk Production:**

- Total production: 230.58 million tonnes with growth of 22.81% over the past 5 years.
- The production has increased by 3.83% during 2022-23 over the estimates of 2021-22.
- Annual growth rates were 6.47% in 2018-19, which later declined to 5.77% in 2021-22.
- **Highest milk-producing States**: Uttar Pradesh (15.72%), Rajasthan, Madhya Pradesh, Gujarat, and Andhra Pradesh.
- Highest AGR was recorded by Karnataka (8.76%), West Bengal, and Uttar Pradesh.

#### **Egg Production:**

- **Total production**: 138.38 billion nos. with a growth of 33.31% growth over the past 5 years as compared to 103.80 billion (2018-19).
- Production has increased annually by 6.77% during 2022-23 over 2021-22.
- Annual growth rate was 9.02% in 2018-19 and 6.19% in 2021-22.
- **Highest egg-producing states**: Andhra Pradesh (20.13%), Tamil Nadu, Telangana, West Bengal and Karnataka.
- Highest AGR was recorded by West Bengal (20.10%), Sikkim and Uttar Pradesh.



#### **Meat Production:**

- **Total production**: 9.77million tonnes and growth of 20.39 % as compared to 8.11 million tonnes in 2018-19.
- Production was increased by 5.13 % in 2022-23 over 2021-22.
- **Major meat production states**: Uttar Pradesh (12.20%), West Bengal, Maharashtra, Andhra Pradesh and Telangana.
- Highest AGR was recorded in Sikkim (63.08%), Meghalaya, and Goa.

**Wool Production:** 

- **Total production**: 33.61 million kg and negative growth of 16.84% over the past 5 years as compared to the estimates of 40.42 million kg during 2018-19.
- Production increased by 2.12% in 2022-23 over 2021-22.
- Major Wool production states: Rajasthan (47.98%), Jammu & Kashmir, Gujarat, Maharashtra, and Himachal Pradesh.
- Highest AGR has recorded by Arunachal Pradesh (35.75%), Rajasthan, and Jharkhand.
