About Hampi's Virupaksha temple:

- The temple is dedicated to **Lord Virupaksha** or **Pampapathi**, a form of Shiva and consort of the local goddess "**Pampa**", and is situated in **Hampi**, **Karnataka**.
- It is a part of the Group of Monuments at Hampi, which is a UNESCO World Heritage Site.
- Originally built in the **7th century**, the temple gained prominence during the **Vijayanagara Empire** (1336 to 1646).
- It is built in the **Dravidian temple** architecture style, featuring grand **gopurams** (3), **Vimana**, **intricate carvings**, and **pillared halls**.
