Recently, the Supreme Court (SC) has held that the independence of the district judiciary is part of the basic structure of the Constitution.

Why independence of the district judiciary is necessary?

- Without **impartial and independent judges** in the district judiciary, justice, a preambular goal, would remain illusory.
- The district judiciary is also the court that is **most accessible to the litigant.**

What did the supreme court say?

- The independence of the district judiciary must also be equally a part of the <u>basic structure</u> of the Constitution.
- The judgment gave a series of **directions to amend the service rules** of the district judiciary and for payment of arrears of **pension**, **additional pension**, **gratuity and other retiral benefits**.
- The directions were based on the recommendations of the court-appointed **Second National Judicial Pay Commission** headed by Justice P.V. Reddi.
- The judgment records the important role played by the district judiciary in the justice administration system by recording the submissions made by its <u>amicus curiae</u>.
