Recently, Government launched the intensified Mission Indradhanush 4.0 For Children and Pregnant Women.

Full Immunization Coverage among children aged 12-23 months increased from 62% (NFHS-4) to 76.4% (NFHS-5)

Mission Indradhanush (IMI) 4.0

- It is one of the flagship schemes under Gram Swaraj Abhiyan and Extended Gram Swaraj Abhiyan.
- It is the largest immunisation programme globally to cover more than three crore pregnant women and 2.6 crore children through the Universal Immunisation Programme (UIP).
- This mission, run in two phases, will administer 12 vaccines to children.
- Aim: To drive towards 90% full immunization coverage of India and sustain the same by the year 2022.
- IMI 4.0 will immensely contribute in **filling the gaps** and make lasting gains towards Universal Immunisation.
- It will ensure that Routine Immunisation (RI) services reach the unvaccinated and partially vaccinated children and pregnant women.



History of Immunization programs in India

- Immunization Programme in India was launched in 1978 as 'Expanded Programme of Immunization' (EPI) by the Ministry of Health and Family welfare.
- The programme was modified as 'Universal Immunization Programme' (UIP) in 1985 to have a phased manner coverage of all districts in the country.
 - It provided life-saving vaccines to all children across the country free of cost to protect them against Tuberculosis, Diphtheria, Pertussis, Tetanus, Polio, Hepatitis B, Pneumonia and Meningitis, Measles etc.

Mission Indradhanush


- **Mission Indradhanush** was launched in 2014 as a special drive to expand full immunization coverage in India.
 - Aim: To protect children and pregnant women of the country from life-threatening diseases.
- Intensified Mission Indradhanush (IMI) was further launched to intensify the immunization programme.
 - **Aim**: to reach each and every child of age up to two years and all those pregnant women who have been left uncovered under the routine immunisation programme/UIP.
 - Pregnant women were administered the tetanus vaccine, ORS packets and zinc tablets.
- Mission Indradhanush 2.0 was introduced to boost the routine immunization coverage in the country.
 - It ensured that all vaccines are available to children and pregnant women in the identified districts and blocks.
- **Diseases targeted**: Diphtheria, whooping cough, tetanus, poliomyelitis, tuberculosis, measles, Hepatitis B
- Areas targeted:
 - High-risk areas identified by the polio eradication programme
 - Areas with low routine immunization (RI) coverage
 - Areas with missed Routine Immunisation (RI) sessions
 - Small villages, hamlets, dhanis or purbas
- Intensified Mission Indradhanush 3.0 was introduced to focus on children and pregnant women who have missed their doses during the pandemic.
 - It intends to accelerate the full immunisation of children and pregnant women through a mission mode intervention.
