

## Kui language

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The state cabinet of Odisha recently approved a proposal to recommend the inclusion of **the Kui language** in the **eighth schedule of the Constitution of India**.

## About Kui language:

- Kui South-Eastern Dravidian language spoken by the Kandhas.
- Khonds/Kandha are an indigenous Adivasi tribal community in India.
- They are the largest tribal group in the state of Odisha.
- It is mostly spoken in Odisha.
- The language is written in the Odia script.
- The Kui language was also referred to as the **Kuinga language** during the **historical period**.
- It is closely related to the **Gondi** and **Kuvi** languages.

## About 8th schedule of the Indian constitution:

- The Eighth Schedule to the Constitution of India lists the official languages of the Republic of India.
- The Government of India is under an obligation to take measures for the development of these languages, such that "they grow rapidly in richness and become effective means of communicating modern knowledge."
  - The Eighth Schedule to the Constitution consists of 22 languages at present: (1)
     Assamese, Bengali, Gujarati, Hindi, Kannada, Kashmiri, Konkani, Malayalam, Manipuri,
     Marathi, Nepali, Oriya, Punjabi, Sanskrit, Sindhi, Tamil, Telugu, Urdu Bodo, Santhali,
     Maithili and Dogri.
- Out of these languages, 14 were initially included in the Constitution.
  - Sindhi language was added in 1967.
  - Thereafter three more languages viz., Konkani, Manipuri and Nepali were included in 1992.
  - Subsequently Bodo, Dogri, Maithili and Santhali were added in 2004.
