#### About Mekong Ganga Cooperation:

- The Mekong–Ganga Cooperation (MGC) was established in year 2000 in Laos.
- The grouping was initially called Ganga Suvarnabhumi Programme (GMSP).
- The organization takes its name from the Ganga and the Mekong, two large rivers in the region.
- It aims at facilitating **closer connections** between the member countries which share the Ganga River and Mekong River basins.
- It comprises **6 member countries**, namely India, Thailand, Myanmar, Cambodia, Laos, and Vietnam.
- The four areas of cooperation are tourism, culture, education, and transportation.
- The **lower Mekong region** holds immense significance for India both in a historic sense and a contemporary one.

#### Flagship projects under Mekong Ganga Cooperation:

- India-Myanmar-Thailand Trilateral Highway project for India-ASEAN Connectivity.
- MGC Traditional Asian **Textiles Museum** in Cambodia.
- India's 50 new Indian Technical and Economic Cooperation (ITEC) scholarships for MGC countries.
- The Centre for Excellence in Software Development training.
- Motor Vehicles Agreement between India-Myanmar-Thailand.
- Exchanges in agriculture, science and technology and water resource management.
