The National Tiger Conservation Authority (NTCA) has proposed that the Nugu Wildlife Sanctuary, adjacent to the Bandipur Tiger Reserve, should be officially designated as a core critical tiger habitat, emphasizing its importance for tiger conservation.

## About Nugu Wildlife Sanctuary:

- Nugu was declared as a Wildlife Sanctuary in 1974.
  - During the year 2003-2004, the area of Nugu Wildlife Sanctuary was added to the Nilgiri Biosphere Reserve.
- Nugu Wildlife Sanctuary is situated in Heggadadevanakote Taluk of Mysore district of Karnataka and comprises of Lakshmanapura State Forest.
- It is situated north of Bandipur National Park.
- On the **southwest side**, the Nugu forest area borders **Alaganchi State Forest** which comes under **Bandipur National Park** and is situated just north of Bandipur.
- The northwestern part of the sanctuary is occupied by the **Nugu Reservoir**.
  - It is built across the Nugu River, a tributary of the Cauvery.
- The **backwaters of Nugu dam** forms the part of the Nugu Wildlife Sanctuary and lies on the **western side of the sanctuary**.
- The forests comprise of southern mixed deciduous trees and dry deciduous scrubs.
- The Nugu Wildlife Sanctuary has been designated as an eco-sensitive zone, ensuring that no commercial or industrial activities, including mining, are allowed in this area.

#### Species:

- The Nugu Wildlife Sanctuary supports a diverse ecosystem with a high-density population of elephants, including adult tuskers.
- It is also home to **tigers**, **leopards**, **wild dogs**, **striped hyenas**, sloth bears, gaurs, sambars, chitals, four-horned antelopes, **smooth-coated otters**, **and marsh crocodiles**.

## About Bandipur Tiger Reserve:

The Bandipur Tiger Reserve, situated in the heart of the '5 B Western Ghats Mountains



**Biogeography Zone**,' is a biodiversity hotspot.

- It is located in Chamarajnagar district in the state of Karnataka.
- It was established as a tiger reserve under Project Tiger in 1973.
- Bordered by the **Mudumalai Tiger Reserve** in the South, **Wayanad Wildlife Sanctuary** in the South West, and separated from **Nagarahole Tiger Reserve** by the **Kabini Reservoir** in the North West, it forms a crucial part of India's rich ecological landscape.
- It is part of the Nilgiri Biosphere Reserve since 1986.
- The **Northern side** of the Tiger Reserve is surrounded by human dominated landscape with villages and agricultural lands.
- Bandipur National Park harbours the Asian elephant, gaur, **Bengal tiger**, sloth bear, four-horned antelope, golden jackal and dhole.
