About the Operation All Clear:

- The Operation All Clear is **first military operation** of **Bhutan** that aimed to flush out the militants from its territory.
- It was launched by the Royal Bhutan Army in 2003.
- The logistical and medical assistance was provided by the **Indian Army**, who had also sealed the Indo-Bhutan border to prevent **militants** from escaping into India.

Achievements of the Operation All Clear:

 It had removed the ULFA (United Liberation Front of Asom), the National Democratic Front of Bodoland and the KLO (Kamatapur Liberation Organization), which had set up camps in Bhutanese territories.

Why were Indian insurgent groups present in Bhutan?

- In the **1990s**, the **Indian military** and **Assam police** had launched **Operations Rhino** and **Bajrang** against **militant** groups in **Assam**, putting them under pressure.
- During this time, **Bangladesh** ceased to be a place of **refuge** too.
- As a consequence, these groups set up camps in **southeast Bhutan**, in the bordering districts of Assam.
