The recently launched India Middle East Europe Economic Corridor (IMEC) is a part of the **Partnership for Global Infrastructure Investment (PGII)**, a West-led initiative to fund **infrastructure projects** across the world.

## What is the Partnership for Global Infrastructure Investment (PGII)?

- It is an infrastructure plan first announced in 2021 during the G7 (Group of Seven) summit in the UK.
  - **G7 countries include** United Kingdom, the United States, Canada, France, Germany, Italy, Japan, and the European Union (EU).
- It was part of the Build Back Better World (B3W) framework which was officially launched in 2022 as a joint initiative to help fund infrastructure projects in developing countries through public and private investments.
- The aim was to **mobilize \$600 billion** from the **G7** by **2027** in order to invest in critical infrastructure as a response to infrastructure projects undertaken by China under the **Belt and Road Initiative (BRI).**
- The stated purpose of **PGII** and the **BRI** is to help secure funding for countries to **build critical infrastructure** like **roads**, **ports**, **bridges**, **communication setups**, etc. and to enhance **global trade** and **cooperation**.

### What was the need for an alternative?

- China began the **BRI** in **2013** to revive the **ancient trade routes** crossing to and from China (Rome in Europe to East Asia).
- The Chinese government helped in providing loans for infrastructure projects countries and some companies were awarded contracts for carrying out the work.
- World Bank report (2019) stated that China provided unsustainable debts to countries that will be unable to repay them which led to takeover of public assets.
- BRI could **increase trade between 1.7-6.2%** for the world, increasing **global real income by 0.7** to 2.9%.
- India opposed the BRI as it included the China-Pakistan Economic Corridor, which connected Kashgar in China with the Gwadar port in Pakistan via Pakistan-occupied Kashmir (PoK).



- It should be **transparent** and **conform** to **respect** the sovereignty and territorial integrity of other countries.
- The G7 initiative of PGII was meant to be **transparent**, **focused** on **building climate change-resilient infrastructure**, and help in achieving objectives of **gender equality** and **health infrastructure development**.

#### Progress under PGII:

- IMEC is a further step in the **PGII process** and announced several projects in **Indonesia** and other countries, on **clean energy, telecommunications, etc.**
- International Development Finance Corporation (DFC) would invest over \$15 million in India's health infrastructure.
  - It includes expansion of eye clinics for corrective surgery of underserved individuals, and an India-based social enterprise for manufacturing safe and affordable women's hygiene products for underserved women in non-metro areas.
- Global Gateway programme of European Union will activate 300 billion of investments in critical connectivity projects (2021-2027), half of which is destined for Africa.
  - Projects have been identified in Africa, Latin America, Caribbean region, Asia and Pacific, and Western Balkans.
