




- He was born on 17 December 1869, in a village near Deoghar, Jharkhand.
- He was raised in a Bengali cultural setting, though of Marathi origin.
- He lost his mother at the age of five and was raised by his widowed brother.
- This upbringing instilled a deep appreciation for Marathi literature.
- He studied **Vedas** and learned the **Bengali language** during his early years.
- Bal Gangadhar Tilak was a significant political influence and mentor.

His Contributions:

Journalistic:



- Sakharam Ganesh Deuskar contributed to various revolutionary Bengali magazines.
- He is known for his work 'Desher Katha' (translated to 'Desh Ki Baat' in Hindi).
- He highlighted the **exploitation of the Indian economy** under British colonial rule.

- He faced **censorship and personal hardships** for his outspoken views.
