## What is Finlandization?

- 'Finlandization' refers to the policy of **strict neutrality** between Russia and the West that Finland followed during the Cold War.
- Finland signed the **Agreement of Friendship, Cooperation, and Mutual Assistance** with the USSR in April 1948.
- The basic tenets of this principle are:
  - strategic partnership
  - recognition of the inviolability of existing borders
  - respect for territorial integrity
  - mutual commitment not to use its territory to harm the security of each other.

### Context



- The treaty became the **basis of Helsinki-Moscow relations**, until a new agreement was signed between both the countries in 1992.
- It lay at the heart of Finland's foreign policy doctrine.
- It is known in international relations studies as the "Paasikivi-Kekkonen line".
  - This is because it became more prominent during the presidentship of Juho Kusti Paasikivi (1946-56) and Urho Kekkonen (1956-82).

# Significance of the treaty

- It **protected Finland from being attacked** or incorporated into the USSR like the Baltic and eastern European states.
- It allowed the country to pursue the path of democracy and capitalism while staying out of the conflict between the great powers.

# Consequence

- Finland did not participate in the Marshall Plan, instead chose a neutral path.
  - Marshall plan is a post-War European recovery programme.
  - It promoted the idea of shared interests and cooperation between the US and Europe.
- It took **neutral positions on matters** on which the Soviet Union and the West disagreed.
- It **stayed aloof from NATO** and European military thereby warding off pressure from Moscow to become part of the Soviet bloc or the Warsaw Pact.

### **Ukraine and Finlandization**

- The Treaty on Friendship, Cooperation, and Partnership between Ukraine and the Russian Federation was signed in **1997**.
- Both nations agreed to "respect each other's territorial integrity and reaffirm the inviolability of the borders existing between them".
- But this was terminated by Ukraine in 2019.
  - Reason: Russia's annexation of Crimea has broken all the most important provisions of the treaty.

## Feasibility of Finlandization of Ukraine

- Finlandization of Ukraine essentially means Ukraine becoming a neutral buffer between the East and West.
  - Russia's quest for making 'Russian Ukraine' prevents such a neutral position in case of Ukraine.
- Ukraine cannot gain a neutral state unless it is offered by Russia, which is impractical.
