Who are Pasmanda Muslims?

- Persian word 'Pasmanda', means the 'ones left behind'.
- It is used to describe depressed classes among the Muslims.
- The term 'Pasmanda Muslims' was first used in 1998 by Ali Anwar Ansari.
 - He founded the Pasmanda Muslim Mahaz.
- Pasmandas include Dalits as of now, but all Pasmandas are not Dalits.

Muslim Society in India:

It consists of several status groups in three categories:

The Ashrafs (honourable ones)

- Ashrafs are Muslims who claim to have a foreign pedigree.
- They are descendants of Muslims from Arabia, Persia, Turkey, Afghanistan.

The Ajlafs (backward Muslims)

Ajlafs are middle-caste converts, who were into ritually clean occupations.

The Arzals (Dalit Muslims)

- Arzals were first recorded in the 1901 census.
- They are from the lowest, **untouchable castes** like halalkhors, helas, lalbegis or dhobis.

Mandal Commission:

• It brought the non-Ashrafs, Ajlafs and Arzals under OBC category.



Demographic Distribution:

• As per Sachar Committee, number of OBC and SC/ST Muslims stood at 40% (all India 2004-05).

Major Pasmanda Demands Include:

- Conducting a caste census.
- Restructuring of the existing reservation categories.
- State support for artisans, craftsperson's, and agricultural labourers.
- Representation in jobs, legislatures and government-run institutions.
